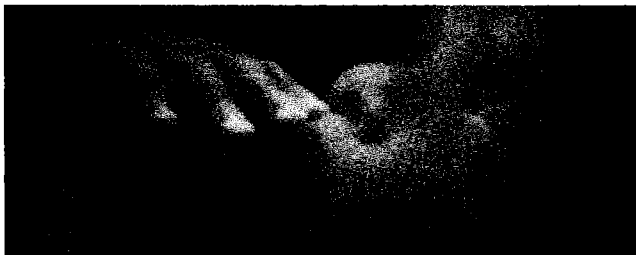


YES FOR LIFE

Northern Kentucky Right to Life is honored to support the “Yes for Life” Alliance, which includes **The Family Foundation of Kentucky, Kentucky Right to Life, Sisters for Life, the Catholic Conference of Kentucky, and the Commonwealth Policy Center.**

In November, 2022, the “Yes for Life” constitutional amendment will be on the Kentucky ballot, and will state: “To protect human life, nothing in this Constitution shall be construed to secure or protect a right to abortion or the funding of abortion.”



The following is the article published in *The Kentucky Citizen*, a publication of **The Family Foundation**, giving more information about this constitutional amendment:

“The Yes for Life Alliance is united in its desire to see life cherished in the Commonwealth and is committed to educating Kentuckians on the Commonwealth’s Pro-Life Constitutional Amendment, which is on the November 8, 2022, ballot.

“After a decade of pro-life legislation being blocked in the General Assembly, voters elected new legislators that have enacted numerous pro-life laws within the last five years.

“However, the gains made in protecting the preborn lives of our children are in danger. Activist judges could overrule the clear will of the people and their representatives, if they were to “discover” a right to abortion or abortion funding in Kentucky’s state constitution.

“Eleven states have already had activist judges do exactly that.

“The proposed Yes for Life Amendment would ensure that it cannot happen here, meaning that the pro-life laws enacted by the General Assembly will remain in place.

“It is for that reason some have called the proposed amendment to be Kentucky’s most significant piece of pro-life legislation in decades.

“The U.S. Supreme Court is currently considering a case that could lead to the overturning of *Roe v. Wade* and return the abortion issue to the states, making this Amendment all the more important and urgent.

“Alongside the 2009 “Trigger Law,” the Yes for Life Amendment will make Kentucky a bold pro-life state and ban abortions if *Roe v. Wade* is overturned.

“Ultimately, voters will decide whether or not they want to end abortion in the Commonwealth. They will

cast their votes in November of 2022.

UNIVERSITY OF LOUISVILLE EXPELS PRO-LIFE MEDICAL STUDENT



One year prior to his graduation from the **University of Louisville School of Medicine**, Austin Clark was formally dismissed.

As reported by *lifeneews.com*, this fourth-year medical student, whose wife was pregnant, and who has a handicapped son, was on the leadership board of **Medical Students for Life**. His problems started when his group hosted speaker **Alex McFarland** in the fall of 2018; by imposing mandatory and possibly expensive security fees, the medical school did everything possible to suppress this pro-life event. Only with the assistance of the **Alliance Defending Freedom**, a legal pro-life foundation, did the event take place.

As stated in his lawsuit against **President Neeli Bendapudi of the University of Louisville School of Medicine** along with 13 others connected to the school, Austin reports some of the professors retaliated against him for his views, calling him "stupid," and questioning if his "brain was working," subjected him to changes in his grades, and forced him to sign a "professionalism contract" that was not a requirement for other students.

As *lifeneews.com* reports, Austin was not allowed to complete his OB/GYN rotations, and the OB/GYN supervisor, **Dr. Thomas Neely**, started calling around to ban Austin from rotations.

On July 15, 2020, he was formally dismissed from the Medical School, one year short of his graduation.

Promoting Abortion

The *lifeneews.com* article documented other connections between the Medical School and the abortion industry.

Dr. Ernest Marshall, who owns **EMW Women's Surgical Center**, the abortion mill in Louisville, has been a teacher at the Medical School for almost 40 years.

In a 2016 grant request, **Dr. Tanya Franklin, Director of the Ryan Family Program**, wrote: "Since implementation of the Ryan Training program, every resident is expected to participate in training as part of

the Family Planning rotation which provides a complete range of involvement for residents and medical students ... The Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology has established the expectation that each resident will participate in the Family Planning rotation. Expected participation includes attendance at EMW Women's Surgical Center, the private abortion clinic with which the UofL program has an established partnership."

Martin Cothran with the **Kentucky Family Foundation** alleged that "the only remaining abortion clinic in Kentucky is being run as an official or quasi-official arm of the University of Louisville's Medical School. Not only is U of L involved in the abortion clinic's activities, but the clinic operates, for all practical purposes, as an extension of the Medical School's program."

SUPREME COURT AGREES TO HEAR KENTUCKY CASE

In March, the **U.S. Supreme Court** agreed to hear a case challenging the constitutionality of a 2018 Kentucky law which prohibited abortions "that will result in the bodily dismemberment, crushing or human vivisection of the unborn child" while still living, a common procedure known as D&E abortions in the second trimester. Of the 3,312 abortions in Kentucky in 2016, 537 were D&E abortions.

Naturally, the **American Civil Liberties Union** and **EMW Women's Surgical Center**, the Louisville abortion mill, filed suit, resulting in a federal judge blocking the enforcement of this ban on dismemberment abortions. Sadly, the **Sixth Circuit Court of Appeals in Cincinnati** upheld the judge's ruling.

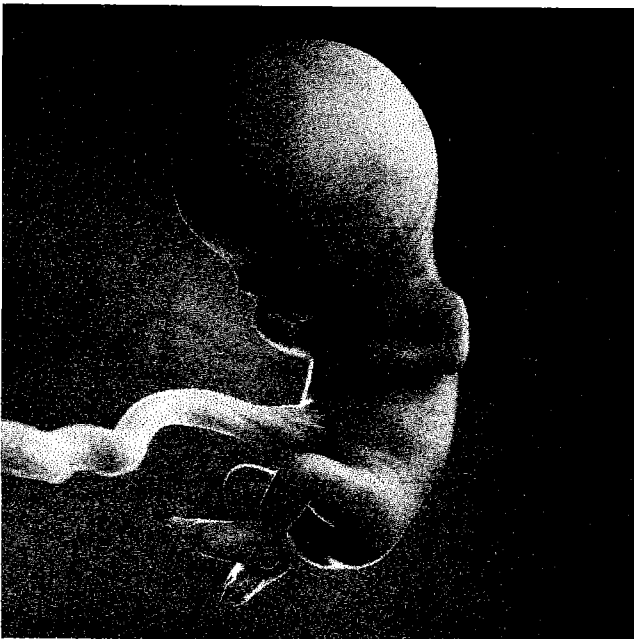
When **Governor Andy Beshear's** administration declined to appeal, **Kentucky Attorney General Daniel Cameron** intervened, and the U.S. Supreme Court has decided to hear this case: *Cameron v. EMW Women's Surgical Center*.



"We're exhausting every possible option to ensure that this law continues to be defended and is ultimately enforced," the Attorney General states. "The law extends compassion and dignity to the unborn by ensuring they

are not subjected to the horror and pain of the dismemberment process while still alive. ...We would never allow the dismemberment of any other living being, and we are going to continue fighting, all the way to the Supreme Court if necessary, so that it can't happen to unborn children."

As described in *lifeneews.com*, "Dismemberment abortion is a procedure in which the abortionist first dilates the woman's cervix and then uses still instruments to dismember and extract the baby from the uterus. The procedure is usually performed between 11 and 24 weeks. By 11 weeks, unborn babies already have fingers and toes, heartbeats, and detectable brain waves. They can respond to touch, yawn, suck their thumbs, and even show signs of being right or left handed."

"It takes about 15 to 26 minutes for an abortion," she explained. "They suffocate [unborn babies], and they also inject a saline solution into their heart until their heart stops for 24 hours before they pull them out piece by piece. So, it's a death penalty to the unborn."

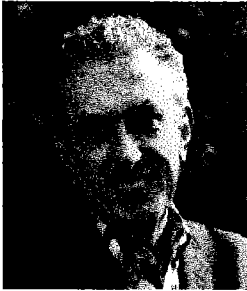

A court granted judgment for \$3 million in a wrongful termination lawsuit filed by a former employee of **Planned Parenthood**, under the **Whistleblower Protection Act**.



Mayra Rodriguez, a 16-year employee of Planned Parenthood, who rose to be the director of its largest abortion facility in Arizona, states: I noticed all the atrocities. I noticed all the irregularities. I noticed the malpractice. I noticed all the stuff the abortionists at Planned Parenthood hide from people, and I completed about it. That got me fired and got me set up. Yeah, I was accused falsely of having narcotics in my office while I was out of my office."

Celebration for Life

This year's Celebration for Life was held on Sunday, September 26, 2021, at **Receptions** in Erlanger, Kentucky.

Music was provided by **Tony Beyer**, a remarkable Northern Kentucky musician.

Invocation

"We come today to remember that abortion is one of those sins that cry out to the Creator. An entire generation, two generations, have been lost to this world," prays **Fr. Joseph Horvath** with Our Lady of Assumption Church, Walton, Kentucky, who offered the Invocation.

"How much hope, how much love, have been lost because children are inconvenient? God will look upon us to make amendment. Let us all ask almighty God to hear our humble prayer."

Pledge of Allegiance

The passionate pro-life **Kentucky State Rep. Savannah Maddox (R)**, representing Grant County and parts of Boone, Kenton, and Scott Counties, led the Pledge of Allegiance, after which she spoke as follows:

"I'm grateful to the people who have put on this Celebration for Life, year after year, and the folks who

have come from all walks of life to support this movement, to protect the sanctity of life. As a legislator, every right, every liberty that I advocate for, is first predicated upon that natural right to life that comes from our Creator. As a Christian mom, it is more than a political issue to me; it's about preserving and protecting God's design for mankind, that sacred bond between man, woman, and child, and how that reflects God's love for His people and for His church."

"As elected officials, we are tasked with making thoughtful decisions for common sense policies, and there is nothing more common sense than the defense of life. This is at the core of our Constitution and our principles."

State Rep. Savannah Maddox led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Constitutional Amendment November, 2022

On November 8, 2022, Kentuckians will have the opportunity to vote for the "Yes for Life" constitutional amendment to our state constitution, which states: "To protect human life, nothing in this Constitution shall be construed to secure or protect a right to abortion or the funding of abortion." In a short presentation by former Boone County State Rep. Addia Wuchner, now president of Kentucky Right to Life, she explained that this amendment would not ban abortions in Kentucky. However, it would keep the Kentucky Supreme Court, now and in the future, from ruling that the Kentucky constitution grants a so-called "right to an abortion" that would legalize the killing of unborn children under the Kentucky constitution. If the U.S. Supreme Court does reverse *Roe v. Wade*, this constitutional amendment would prohibit the Kentucky Supreme Court from legislating from the bench.

"Other pieces of similar legislation has passed in other states."

"Planned Parenthood associations across the country have amassed \$94 billion to take on states like Kentucky and Kansas, who oppose this constitutional limit, on which you will have the opportunity to vote pro-life."

She explained that the Alliance for Life will be raising the necessary funds to put on a media campaign, including television, radio, billboards, etc., to convince Kentuckians to support and vote for this amendment. This will be a great opportunity to teach and explain to others that abortion is the painful destruction of an unborn child, and what harm and suffering abortion brings to the mother of that child.

Next, Campbell County State Rep. Joe Fischer, who sponsored this constitutional amendment, explained that the Tennessee Supreme Court "found, discovered, and conjured up a right to an abortion in the Tennessee constitution. And for 10 years now, Tennessee has been unable to enforce any of its pro-life legislation. Even if *Roe v. Wade* is overturned, Tennessee would not be able

to enforce its pro-life laws. I don't want to see that happen in Kentucky. So, to preempt that possibility, we need to amend our state constitution."

Our Guest Speaker Austin Ruse

"There are two moments about which God wants us to be concerned: the present moment and the moment we face our Lord. He does not want us to wallow in the past and miss this moment. Nor does He want us to worry about the future. Certainly, we should have plans and goals, but these plans and goals cannot weigh us down," expressed our guest speaker, **Austin Ruse**.

"I wish I had lived in another age. I wish I had lived in the 1950's, when everything was so great. The faith was practiced by all. That would have been the time for me. For some, perhaps they wish that they had lived in the middle ages with great saints and spiritual giants, who roamed the Earth at a time when great debates captivated the world and the church. This is the disposition of nostalgia.

"And then there is the disposition of fear. The world is so frightening. They are coming for us. They are coming for our faith, and the enemy encamps all around us.

"Thirdly, there is the disposition of distraction, perhaps the greatest of all dispositions that take us away from the present moment. By distraction, of course, I mean video games, sports, television, the iPhone, anything that can take us away from the current horrors that face us, that can help us forget those horrors that face us.

"We must admit, however, that the present moment is pretty awful. Our enemies are in fact encamped all around us. They are imposing their ideology all across this land at all levels of society. To live in fear, nostalgia and distraction are completely understandable.

"Abortion takes upwards of a million children a year. Family breakdown continues. Seventy percent (70%) of black children are born into fatherless homes. Fifty percent (50%) of which children are born into fatherless homes. Sexually transmitted diseases are rampant, at epidemic levels. Some diseases have reappeared that we thought we had vanquished.

"Pornography is rampant. It is for free, supported by paid advertisement. In the past, if you wanted to view this

material you would have to click onto what was the paid site. There was a barrier to entry. Then some guys came up with the idea of streaming it for free. This is precisely what has caused the explosion of the viewing of pornography. This is what allows kids with iPhones to access the most brutal kind of obscenity on the playground. This is what has trapped and enslaved millions of men and women. This has destroyed families. It is reported that 60% of divorce actions cite addiction to this particular thing.

"And then there's the explosion of transgenderism. Twenty years ago, so-called gender clinics hardly existed. Now there are more than 60, since the last time I researched it, all waiting to shoot kids full of puberty blockers and cross-sex hormones, subjecting them to mutilating surgery. How can we do this to our children?"

The New State Religion

"All of these evils are supported by dogma of a new state religion, a newly established state religion, which views Christians as heretics," continued our guest speaker.

"Under the new state church, the government must be 'neutral,' in order to serve the secular purpose and have primarily secular effects, and be opposed to the transcendent world of eternity.

"Secularity has come to mean without religion and without God. So, when the government insists upon secularity, it is insisting upon a politics and a law without God, without religion. What this means is that the government chooses to take sides in the modern culture wars." Mr. Ruse continued to explain that as we have seen, those who hold the Judeo-Christian principle of the sanctity of all human life have been excluded from expressing their Biblical views in the marketplace of ideas. To enter into the conversation, one is forbidden to express basic principles that find their roots in religious beliefs, and/or on unchanging moral beliefs based on a belief in a transcendent, loving God.

As this new state religion finds new followers, what results is "a series of decisions striking at the heart of Christian belief and practice and the increasing imposition of this new secular view, this nonreligious view without God, on Christian people, including in our schools." First the Supreme Court decision made "contraception a constitutional right for married couples, and a few years later for single people. This was followed

almost immediately by *Roe v. Wade*, imposing a right to abortion in all 50 states.

"Now you may think it is my message to you that it is bleak, that all that is left to do is hunker down and hope for the best and wait for the storm to pass over us."

It's a Great Time to Be Alive

"Let us consider the question of good and evil. Our church teaches that God can bring good out of evil. The obvious question becomes, what can He bring out of the evils of our times.

"For one thing, the greatest coming together of His Christian children, what we have seen over the past quarter century, is something we have not seen since the great splitting of Christian faithful. If God could feel pain, I believe the pain of that split would be the greatest of all. He wants all of His children to be one. We are putting aside our theological and ecclesiastical differences in a way that we have never seen, and are banning together to fight back against the new state religion.

"We are working together to protect the unborn child, marriage, and family, and indeed to protect the right that each of us has to practice our faith in a way that we see fit.

"I can count on a strong believer, even one who believes differently than I do, that God wants abortion to end. He wants the slaughter of the innocent to end. He wants marriage restored to the way that He made it. He wants all of us to be able to discover Him and proclaim Him in our own way, free from interference in coercion by the state. What He wants, even more than all of these things, is for His children to be one, and eventually to be with Him in Heaven.

"We are present to one of the greatest debates in the history of the world. What is the human person after all? What is the debate over transgenderism, pornography, abortion? What are they really about? They're about a proper understanding of the human person, and are honored and we are blessed to be here. It's unsettling that we get to have a piece of this. We need to not miss the present moment. Recent history demonstrates abundantly that we are living through one of the greatest epics that the church has ever known.

"It is not in spite of the manifold and manifest problems in society and the Church that makes this the finest time to be faithful, but precisely because of them. God called us here now, when He knew the societal collapse would come. He called us here now, when the Church would come under attack.

"During the whole of St. Pope John Paul II's magnificent pontificate, his central message to young people, indeed to each of us, is that we must strive for greatness of heart and never settle for mediocrity. It means participating in the public struggle. This is a cup that none of us should forgo.

"Remember, there has never been a finer time to be a faithful Christian. Your descendants will say, 'Weren't they amazing? How I wish I could have been there,'" expresses Mr. Ruse.

"This is the new age waiting to be born. Most of us will not live long enough to see the great age we have

lived in, on the cusp of something new and wonderful. Our children and grandchildren, our great-grandchildren, will look back upon us in this age. They will look back in great envy.

"We need not be envious of times past. When trouble closes in and all around us, when there are so few of us, there are great saints and spiritual giants. Each faithful Christian, each one of us, is so badly needed. There is no finer time to be a faithful Christian as right now."

John Bauer Award

John J. Bauer was a founding member of NKRTL, who died in 1976 doing volunteer work for children with special needs. As described by the principal of the school served by John: "What other people said was impossible to do with children who had mental disabilities, he did."

The first award was given to our new Board member, **Mike Davis**. I am sure you have all seen throughout Northern Kentucky the yard signs that read "Choose Life" and "Choose Jesus, Choose Life." Mike has been instrumental in placing these signs at churches, schools, homes, and businesses, allowing pro-lifers throughout the area to give witness to their concern for unborn children and their support for the pro-life movement.

The second award was presented to **Austin Ruse**, our guest speaker, to honor him especially for his work at the **United Nations**, where he is a Christian voice for the unborn child, influencing delegates from around the world not to accept abortion as healthcare or a human right, but to oppose the legalization of the killing of unborn children.

John G. Kenkel, Sr., Award

Jack Kenkel was so kind to fund another award to be given to a school or individual student, each year, on either side of the river, to recognize their efforts in the pro-life movement. Jack's father, John G. Kenkel, Sr., was not only a longtime supporter of NKRTL, but he served for many years as a volunteer manning our then-office in Covington.

The first recipient is a young student at **St. Edmund Campion Academy in Cincinnati**, who sent this last summer as an intern for **Created Equal**. **Isabelle Egan** underwent 180 hours of training and 90 hours of outreach experience, learning more about how to do sidewalk counseling, speaking to people in a calm and charitable voice, which she explained to them what an abortion is. Not only did she spend a lot of time learning, but she practiced her skills on the sidewalks of downtown Columbus, Ohio, ending the internship with a weeklong trip, with her other interns, to New York City, reaching out to those entering abortion clinics. Isabelle is, no doubt, a remarkable and courageous high school student.

The second award was given to **Mary's Pro-Life Boot Camp**, which is conducted by the **Franciscan Daughters of Mary**, who also run the **Rose Garden** on Madison Avenue in Covington. The boot camp is for our high school students where they hear a number of speakers, learn more about the abortion issue and how to respond to questions, and are encouraged to be pro-life and be involved with the pro-family movement. Last summer, the boot camp, along with **Cincinnati Right to Life**, sponsored an abortion survivor whose testimony surely touched the hearts and minds of these young men and women. The sisters are doing a remarkable job in many areas, and NKRTL is very honored to promote their continual efforts. The award consisted of a donation of \$1,000.00.

Closing Remarks

The Master of Ceremonies for the Celebration was **Fred H. Summe**, the President of **Northern Kentucky Right to Life**, who remarked:

"There are a lot of other people to whom we need to express our gratitude. However, today I want to thank one group that deserves our appreciation. And that is you. You're the ones that are concerned about the American holocaust, the intrinsically evil act of abortion, which has taken the lives of so many of our fellow Americans. It is you who have given public witness to your family, friends, and associates to encourage them to be pro-life. You not only vote pro-life, but you're the ones out there campaigning and supporting those who are running for public office, who hold the Judeo-Christian principle of the sanctity of all innocent human life. It is you who volunteer for the pregnancy centers throughout the Greater Cincinnati area. It is you who pray every day. It is you who attend the marches, rallies, and other public events. It is you who help educate other people, especially our youth. It is you, yes, you, who have brought God's grace to our nation by responding to **St. Pope John Paul II's** words, which he spoke when he first visited the United States, and where he commanded:

We ask for, most importantly, Your blessing upon November, 2022, when people have the chance to vote on this important issue.

"We look forward to the day that children are laughing and playing and walking this planet because of the work that's happened even on a Sunday afternoon right now. So, Father, we once again commit all of this to You, in Jesus' name.

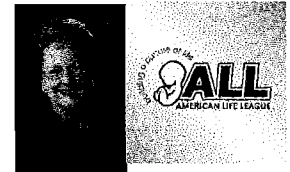

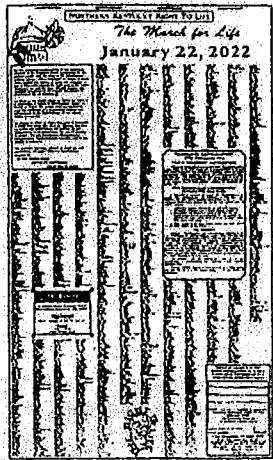
